Shabbos Zachor

The Shabbos before Purim is referred to as Shabbos Zachor, the Shabbos of Remembrance. We read the Maftir from Parsha Ki Seitzei which teaches us to remember the vicious Amalek attack on us, to teach this lesson to our children, and the obligation to wipe out the evil Amalek. The reason this Maftir is read before Purim is because Haman is from Amalek. The men fulfill a Torah commandment by listening to this portion being read. There is a difference of opinion regarding the obligation of a woman to hear this reading. It is customary for the women to hear it. We will be reading this portion at approximately **10:15 am** this Shabbos morning. There will be a second reading of Parshas Zachor after Kiddush.

Purim Laws

- One is obligated to hear the reading of the Megillah once at night and once in the morning.
- On Purim, one should add “Al – Hanissim” in the “Shmoneh Esrei” and Birkas Hamazon during the night and day of Purim. If one forgot to add it, one does not repeat these prayers.
- In America we do not add “Al -Hanissim” in the above prayers on “Shushan Purim”- Sunday night, March 12th, and Monday, March 13th.

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- One must give charity to at least two people in need during Purim day. The amount of charity to be given for each person in need is the amount of money required to buy a meal. The Rabbi will distribute the tzedakkah on Purim day.
- One must send on Purim Day a gift of two different types of food to at least one person. The food must be ready to be eaten.
- One is not allowed to send shalach manos to a mourner. However, one is permitted to send shalach manos to the mourner's spouse or children.
- One must eat a festive meal during Purim day.
- One should complete the Purim Seuda or at least eat most of the Seuda by sunset, on Sunday at **7:33 pm**.
- It is customary to start reviewing the laws of Pesach on Purim day itself.

All the above laws apply to men and women.
