The Nine Days begins Thursday at Sundown, July 12

“With the advent of the month of Av, we diminish our joy”

Eating

1. Abstain from meat/ chicken and wine/grape juice
 - Helps lessen happiness
 - Recalls sacrifices of meat and wine which ended with the destruction of the Bais Hamikdosh
2. Permitted on Shabbos or Seudos Mitzvah (ex: Bris)
3. Permitted for sick people or children up to age six
4. Permitted for health reasons

Cleaning Clothes/ Wearing freshly laundered Clothes

1. One may not clean clothes
 - Should not appear as if unconcerned about tragedy
 - Prohibited from giving it to gentile to clean
 - Applies to bed linen, handkerchiefs, tablecloths and towels
2. Permitted to wash diapers and baby garments which constantly soil.
3. One may not wear freshly laundered clothes.
 - Applies to suits, shirts, pants, dresses, sweaters, jackets, etc. However, if items are worn a short time before the “Nine Days”, then permitted.
 - Applies to not using fresh bed linen
 - Applies to not using fresh towels
4. Prohibited to buy new garments or shoes
 - Permitted to buy non-leather shoes for Tisha B’Av if not bought before the “Nine Days”.

5. Sewing or tailoring new clothes prohibited
 - Needlepoint, embroidery prohibited
 - Prohibited to iron or press clothes

Bathing

1. Bathing or washing for pleasure prohibited
 - To remove dirt and perspiration it is permitted to bathe quickly in cool water and not remain directly under the shower head
 - For medical reasons permitted
 - For mitzvah (ex: going to the mikvah) permitted
 - To refresh oneself one is permitted to wash face and hands in cold water
 - Soaping or shampooing prohibited unless dirt or perspiration will not come off otherwise
 - On Erev Shabbos one may bathe normally with hot water if he always bathes every Erev Shabbos with hot water.
2. Swimming prohibited
 - Medical reasons permitted
 - Permitted to take a quick dip in pool to remove dirt or perspiration

Home decorating, painting should not be done

Cutting nails permitted
